If you walked through the breezeways of JLS on September 30th, you would have been impressed at the colorful artwork on the doors. The messages conveyed on the doors were even more amazing. The theme of the Door art was , "**What Does Kindness Look Like at JLS.**" In a variety of creative ways, the students illustrated this theme on poster paper and draped the paper across the doors. The students in each WIP class collaborated to create drawings and slogans to remind everyone that the spirit of kindness is alive and well at JLS.

Another event organized by the counselors at JLS is **Unity Day**. The Kindness door posters will be on display throughout the school on October 21 to celebrate Unity Day. Unity Day is a nationwide campaign to stamp out bullying. One of the tenets of the JLS Way, the school motto, is the importance of connection and inclusion. Unity Day and activities planned for that day fit in with forming connections and relationships. All staff and students are encouraged to wear orange to show support of the theme of Unity Day.

## School Dance Scoop

**All you need to know & more!**

### Q. When and where are the school dances held?

A. JLS will host three dances on the Fridays of: October 16th, February 19th, and May 13th. The dances will be held in the Cafetorium.

For students who want to attend but don't want to be on the dance floor the entire time, the breezeway is made available (and secure) for students to take a break, play some games, and just hang out together. There is something for everyone at the dance!



### Q. When and where can I buy tickets?

A. Lunchtime Monday through Friday, and after school Thursday and Friday during the week of the dance at the Student Store. Tickets cannot be purchased at the dance. Students must present their tickets and student ID at the door. Tickets are \$5 each.

### Q. What time does the dance start and end?

A. Dances are from 7:00pm to 9:30pm but ends at 10:00pm for 8th graders only. Doors open at 6:50pm.

### Q. What if I arrive late or need to leave early?

A. Doors close at 7:30pm. Late entries are only allowed with prior approval. Inform a staff member if you need to leave early. A parent/guardian must meet the student at the door. There is no re-entry.

### Q. Are there any snacks or drinks at the dance?

A. Chips, crackers, candy, water and soda are sold for a charge.

### Q. Anything else I need to be aware of?

A. The same school dress code is enforced at the dance. There is a "no cell phone" policy. Leave your cell phone at home. Otherwise, it needs to be checked in at the coat check. Any student who needs to make a phone call may do so with a school phone or a chaperone's cell phone.
