Safety is a top priority at JLS and as of late, drivers in the drop off and pick up areas are showing poor judgement when it comes to student safety. PLEASE slow down and follow the very clear rules about how to conduct yourselves!

- Observe the 25 mph speed limit in school zones at all times. Avoid making U-turn and other illegal or unsafe maneuvers on East Meadow.
- Be alert. School commute routes carry hundreds of pedestrians, skateboarders, bicyclists, and cars. When preparing to turn right, always look for cyclists in the bike lanes.
- Be aware of all school commute routes. Watch for sudden movements ofbicyclists, pedestrians and scooters onto the roadway from the sidewalk.
- Be especially alert for young children. JLS abuts an elementary school.
 Young children cannot judge speed or distance of vehicles moving toward them, and
 they think cars can stop suddenly. Young children also have a narrower field of
 vision than adults do, about one-third less.
- Yield right of way to pedestrians in crosswalks, which exist at all intersections even when crosswalks are not marked.
- No right turn on red at Waverley and East Meadow when children are present.
- Obey Crossing Guards. They help students cross safely and reduce driver confusion during peak congestion hours.


