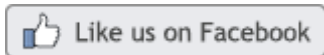

Students MUST audition on the instrument/voice they play in their school performing ensemble. 4th grade General music students may audition on any instrument or voice, only one pianist will be chosen to receive a scholarship. Contestants are compared with students of the same age/grade and/or ability level.
