

With the goal of making VTA transit more efficient, changes are coming for VTA bus service in Palo Alto. Cuts or changes are being considered for the VTA 88 bus (which serves many Gunn HS students) and the VTA 35 bus.

Share your thoughts with VTA staff on **Wednesday, May 18, 6pm** at Rinconada Library (1213 Newell Road, Palo Alto), Embarcadero Room. We strongly encourage bus users, including Gunn students and their parents, to attend this meeting to learn more and weigh in with VTA.

VTA is in the initial stages of considering various options for changing service. VTA staff will present various options and hear what community bus riders think. Scratch Day @ Gunn 2016

Come visit Gunn High School's third annual Scratch Day! Learn how to program in a fun, safe environment.

Scratch <http://scratch.mit.edu> is a program developed by MIT to teach children computer science in an easy, interactive way by creating their own games and apps-introductory CS courses at Harvard, Berkeley, and even Gunn use Scratch as a first language.

Every year, over a hundred universities and schools around the world host Scratch Day to introduce students to computer science. Scratch@Gunn will take place on May 14th, 2016, 10:00-2:00 at Gunn High School, room N-215 (computer lab). It will be supervised by Gunn CS teacher Mr. Joshua Paley.

The event is free, and students of all ages are welcome: Scratch Day is the perfect introduction to programming for middle schoolers. We have enough computers for everyone, but you can bring a laptop if you prefer. Snacks will be provided.
