**National Student Walkout For Government Action To End Gun Violence
Wednesday, March 14 10-10:17am**

This Wednesday, March 14 many students across the nation will be participating in a National Student Walkout for meaningful government action to end gun violence. The walkout will last for 17 minutes, 1 minute for each victim of the recent mass shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Florida.

Some students at JLS will be organizing and participating in the National Student Walkout. Should you choose to join with your student in this Walkout Activity, please remember that school is in session and that you need to sign in at the office. All community members are welcome to join the Paly and Palo Alto Community Walkout (gathering will occur on the sidewalk at Embarcadero and El Camino Real between 10:00 and 10:17am). This event will be peaceful and suitable for all ages.

You can stand together with the voices of students and call your federal legislators on March 14 to demand stronger gun-violence prevention legislation. RESOLUTION OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE PALO ALTO COUNCIL OF PTA'S

The following message has been sent to the superintendent, board of education members and principals:

"On Wednesday, March 7th, 2018, the Executive Board of the Palo Alto Council of PTAs unanimously resolved to strongly support the participation of PAUSD students in the National Student Walkout of March 14th in support of actions to end gun violence. The Executive Board hereby resolved to support students' rights to acts of civil disobedience and to exercise their right to free speech. The Executive Board urges the district to ensure that no student will be threatened with or experience punitive action as a result of exercising their rights beyond an unexcused absence."

Principal Hickey's Message about the National School Walkout on Wednesday March 14

I've received many inquiries from students and parents about the National School Walkout on Wednesday, March 14th at 10 AM. We have adjusted our schedule for that day to include an extended brunch from 10 AM-10:35 AM. Students who wish to participate in the walkout during the beginning of brunch may do so without worrying about missing class. If students choose not to participate, they will have a longer brunch.

While we have created the opportunity for our students to participate in civic engagement activities, safety is always our number one priority. We want our students to be safe both physically and emotionally. While we support students who want to participate in the walkout, no student should feel pressure to be a part of the walkout. The school also encourages students to participate in a positive way. To this end, student council is planning some activities for students to participate in should choose to. They will communicate with students upon our return to school next Tuesday.

Finally, all students must stay on campus during the extended brunch time unless they are checked out at the attendance office. We will provide supervision to the edges of campus during the 17 minute walkout time from 10-10:17 AM.

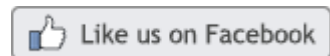
